

# The 3rd Sunday of Lent

## Jn 4:5-42

**Jesus said to her,** "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty..."

When was the last time you got in a conversation with a stranger? What was the conversation about?

**In the story of the woman at the well, Jesus symbolized the Spirit as a free-flowing artesian spring. The Church carries that rich symbol into waters of baptism.**

Images of water in the Old Testament represent God's gift of life and his guidance. When God breathed his Spirit over the water in Genesis 1, God empowered water to give life and provide abundance. God saved Noah and his family through the destructive waters of a flood. He led his people through the waters of the Red Sea. He guided the chosen across the water of the Jordan River to the Promised Land.

Closely connected to the activity of the Spirit, images of water in the New Testament represent cleansing and God's gift of new life. As water and blood flowed from the side of Christ on the cross, that

same water and blood washed one clean through the Spirit (see John 19:33-34). Like the waters of gestation in a mother's womb, the Spirit gives new life; "For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body... and we were all given to drink of one Spirit." [1 Corinthians 12:13]

### How does water remind you of God's life-giving Spirit?

One small conversation became a moment of revelation and salvation. A few chosen words overcame social prejudice and bridged God to a lost soul. Our moments of small conversation can connect others to God only if we allow God to speak through us.

### How can you get out of God's way and allow his Spirit to speak through you in your everyday affairs?

Ms. Carroll was a woman of deep Catholic faith, who wanted those receiving her scholarship to benefit from her legacy by being better prepared to face the challenges of the world today and the generations to come, in addition to using their education for the betterment of the entire community.



### TRADITIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

Academic scholarships of \$3,000 each will be available to residents of Sarasota County, Florida. These educational opportunities are open to graduating seniors and recent high school graduates (within the last 2 years) from Catholic, private or public high schools in Sarasota County, Florida who wish to pursue an undergraduate degree in any accredited college or university.



### Non-traditional Scholarship

Academic scholarships of \$3,000 each will be available to residents of Sarasota County, Florida. These educational opportunities are open to adult learners who are returning to school to obtain a college degree or vocational certification after being out of high school for three or more years (non-traditional students).

**RENEWABLE:** Each scholarship can be renewed annually up to a total of five academic years for students maintaining a minimum GPA of 3.2 on a 4.0 (unweighted) scale.

## ORDINARY TIME EXPLAINED

Ordinary time is the longest season of the liturgical year. It begins after January 6, the Epiphany, and goes until Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

That period can last anywhere from five to eight weeks, depending on when Easter is celebrated. Ordinary time picks up again after Pentecost Sunday and lasts from twenty-three to twenty-seven weeks, until the end of the liturgical year, the Saturday before Advent begins.

Why the name ordinary? "Ordinary" is not in contrast to "extraordinary" or "special" but rather stresses the Latin language notion of "ordinal" or numbered Sundays. The Latin title for the season, tempus ordinarium, conveys the sense that this time of the year is measured or numbered time. Measured time can allude simply to the numbered Sundays, or the notion that these Sundays are a "measured" time to deepen and immerse ourselves completely in the realities of Jesus' incarnation, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection. Ordinary time offers us the opportunity to connect the ordinary lived experiences of our lives with those of Jesus, who modeled for us how to live a truly human existence.
